SAINT OF THE WEEK:

Saint Bernadette Soubirous

Bernadette was born in 1844, the oldest of nine children in a poor family, in Lourdes, France. Because she contracted cholera and suffered from asthma, she lived most of her life sickly. When she was 14 while collecting firewood, she received her first apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary in a grotto. On one visit, the grotto's muddy water had been cleared and fresh, clean water flowed. At the thirteenth apparition, the Blessed Mother told Bernadette that "a chapel should be built and a procession formed." On the sixteenth vision, Mary identified herself as the Immaculate Conception. Her testimony caused divisions in Lourdes. However, no one could explain why many sick people were cured when bathing in the clean waters at the grotto. Uncomfortable with the attention she was receiving, she joined the Sisters of Charity where she worked as an infirmiry assistant and sacristan. Suffering from severe pain due to tuberculosis in her knee, she died in 1879. Bernadette was canonized in 1933. She is the patroness of illness, people ridiculed for their piety, poverty, shepherds, and Lourdes. Her feast day is April 16.

SPIRITUAL GROWTH

UNDERSTANDING OF THE HOLY MASS:

Concluding Rite (Part 2)

What do we learn from the concluding words of Mass, "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord?"

- We have a mission to love and serve the Lord. Every time we celebrate Mass God invites us to establish a deeper relationship with Him and with our neighbor. Love of God and love of neighbor are inseparable. Hence each Holy Mass urges us to remember "the least among us" and "protect human life and dignity."
- The Eucharist is a source of strength for fellowship, witness, and service. The celebration of the Eucharist requires sincere participation by the worshipper; listen carefully to the Scriptures, respond meaningfully to the acclamations, sing the hymns devoutly, join heartily in the Eucharistic Prayers, and received Communion with deliberate faith, hop, and love. In this way, the Holy Mass can transform us.
