SAINT OF THE WEEK:

Saint Damien of Molokai

Damien was born in Belgium in 1840, the youngest of seven children. In his early 20s he entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. His older brother, a member of that same religious order, was supposed to go to Hawaii. However, Brother Damien took his place when his brother got too ill to travel there. After months of study and devotion to prayer, Brother Damien was ordained a priest on the island of Hawaii. He spent nine years in ministry there. In 1873 Fr. Damien discerned his call to serve the leper colony on the island of Molokai. It was a lawless community when he arrived, so Fr. Damien provided the leadership necessary to get the people to build houses, schools, and a parish church, Saint Philomena. He cared for the sick and buried the dead. He spent the remaining 16 years of his life on Molokai. Although only five percent of the human population is susceptible to leprosy, Fr. Damien did contract it. He spent his last four years of life in prayer and work. He continually prayed the rosary and prayed in front of the Eucharist. “It is at the foot of the altar that we find the strength we need in our isolation,” he wrote. He was canonized a saint in 2009 and his feast day is May 10.
