FINANCIAL STATUS – MARCH 2019

March was a good month for the parish and mission. Having five Sundays helped.

Saint Patrick: Our collection offerings were \$2,115.00 higher than in 2018. Overall assessable income was \$2,826.00 higher than last year. There was a \$2,430.65 decrease in non-assessable income because both fish fries occurred in March 2018, while this year we had one in March and one in April. Therefore, our overall profit for March was \$848.85. Total expenses were down \$2,665.89 from last year, so our net operating income for March was \$3,514.74.

Sacred Heart: With increased offerings and CD income our assessable income was \$1,350.16 higher than last March. Due to a generous \$2,500.00 gift from a former parishioner, our non-assessable income was \$1,792 higher than March 2018, with our overall income \$3,142.42 higher than last year. Our expenses were \$1,046.10 higher this March due to fulfilling ordinary maintenance and repair needs. Therefore, our net operating income for March is \$2,096.32.

Thank you for your continued generosity to the parish. I try to keep our costs down as much as possible. God bless you.

SAINT OF THE WEEK:

Saint Catherine of Siena

Catherine was born in Siena, Italy in 1347. She was the 25th child born to her mother. Her father was a cloth dyer. She lived a quiet life as a Third Order Dominican in her home. The sisters taught her to read. Something changed her when she was 21. She described an experience she referred to as her "mystical marriage to Christ." She received a vision to reenter public life and to help the poor and sick. Catherine became involved in politics by working to keep Italian city-states loyal to the Pope. In the last five years of her life, Catherine wrote persuasive letters to the Pope to leave Avignon, France, and return to Rome. Thus, she was instrumental in restoring the Papacy to Rome and in brokering peace deals during a time of factional conflict and war between the Italian city-states. Because of her extreme fasting, she became very ill and died in 1380 at the age of 33. Catherine of Siena is one of the four female saints known as “Doctors of the Church” because of her writings and prayers. Saint Catherine's feast day is April 29. She is the patroness against fire, illness, miscarriages, people ridiculed for their faith, sexual temptation, and for nurses.
